Call for Papers:

The international conference will be dedicated to ancient and medieval routes and their relationship with the landscape, intended as a living organism. The discussion will focus on new tools and methods of research and publication, in continuity with the international round table “Ancient and Medieval Routes: new approaches and new tools”, held in Bordeaux on November 15th, 2016.

The discussion revolves around three thematic axes:

Theme 1: Routes and settlements, control and landscape structuration tools, ranking of the communication network.

Theme 2: Impact of the route on the life of territories:

- a. Social transformation from the economic, religious and cultural perspective.
- b. The road in landscape and the landscape seen from the road: the concept of “road territory”.
- c. Hospitality and service facilities in a diachronic perspective.

Theme 3: Scientific dissemination and capitalization:

- a. Ancient and medieval routes on the Web: a new time for scientific publications, open also to the public.
- b. Archaeological parks and musealization.
- c. Cultural itineraries and historical trekking: a balance between enhancement and fashion trend.
